2018

State legislature passed HB 35, establishing the Municipal Alternative Voting Methods Pilot Project.



2021

Statewide, 23 jurisdictions are using RCV, including 10 in Salt Lake County.

 Bluffdale, Cottonwood Heights, Draper, Magna, Midvale, Millcreek, Riverton, Salt Lake City, Sandy, and South Salt Lake

First year the pilot project was in effect. Two cities, Payson and Vineyard, chose to use ranked choice voting for their multiwinner at-large city council seats.

How Does RCV Compare To Our Current System?

Traditional Method for Municipal Elections

- Every candidate who files is placed on the ballot for the Primary Election. The two candidates with the most votes advance to the General.
- •With only two candidates in the General Election, it is impossible for a candidate to win with a plurality.

Ranked Choice Voting Pilot Project

- Eliminates the need for a
 Primary Election. Candidates
 with the fewest votes are
 eliminated one by one in a
 single election until someone
 wins a majority.
- Voters secondary preferences are counted when their first preference is eliminated. This continues for as many rounds as necessary for a candidate to reach a majority.

Ranked Choice Voting (RCV)

Ranked-choice voting (RCV) is a system in which voters rank candidates in order of their preference on their ballots. First preference votes are counted in the first round. If a candidate wins a majority of firstpreference votes, he/she is declared the winner. If no candidate receives a majority, the candidate with the fewest first-preference votes is eliminated, lifting the second-preference choices indicated on the ballots. A new tally is conducted to determine whether any candidate has won a majority of the adjusted votes. The process is repeated as many times as necessary for a candidate to receive a majority.


