


**SALT LAKE VALLEY SOLID MANAGEMENT FACILITY
FEE WAIVER POLICY AND GUIDELINES
UPDATED JUNE 2020**

1. All governmental agencies, i.e. federal, state, county, municipal, special districts and school districts shall be charged. These governmental bodies have their own revenue sources and will be charged the appropriate disposal fee to dispose of their waste at the landfill.
2. Exemptions for disposal fees (Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) only), for governmental agencies, may be granted for community service projects if a written request for exemption is made seven days in advance to the Executive Director of the Salt Lake Valley Solid Waste Management Facility. Only refuse collected from property located within the boundaries of Salt Lake City or Salt Lake County is eligible for a fee waiver. Approval by the Salt Lake Valley Solid Waste Management Council is not necessary in such instances. The Executive Director has the responsibility to make the determination. A file will be maintained of all written requests together with the response.
3. All requests by nonprofit organizations for a Fee Waiver (MSW only), will be required to follow Policy 1200 – Salt Lake County Countywide Policy on Contributions, In-Kind Assistance, and Fee Waiver (Attached to this document). Applications for Fee Waiver must be made in writing and submitted to the Solid Waste Management Council (SWMC). Requests must be made at least 90 days in advance of the event to be reviewed. The submission of the application or the demonstration of eligibility does not guarantee approval. All applications are on a “per event” basis and not for ongoing operations. The application must be complete, signed, and accompanied by supporting documentation to be considered. The SWMC shall review the application and make a recommendation for acceptance or denial to the Mayor’s Office as specified in Policy 1200.
4. Fee waivers for governmental agencies and nonprofits events shall not exceed 100 Tons per event and 1,000 tons per year total for all combined events. Governmental agencies and nonprofits are responsible for all DEQ and Salt Lake County Health Department Fees, required for the disposal quantities.
5. An exemption for disposal may be granted to an on-site contractor for work at the landfill as approved by the Executive Director.
6. An exemption may be granted to the lessor of landfill property should such a provision be included in the lease.
7. In the event of a natural disaster, a state of emergency, or other circumstance requiring immediate disposal, the County Council or County Mayor may suspend particular entities from disposal fees at the Landfill.
