

7-Day Case Rate Increased By 20% In One Week






Delta Now Represents Most Variant Cases

Recommendations For Action

Recommendation #1: Educate doctors in high-risk areas about vaccinations

Make in-person visits to doctors' offices to educate doctors and staff about the importance of vaccination for patients and the recent rise in COVID cases.

Recommendation #2: Provide direct vaccine education

As cases continue to rise, direct education and outreach on the need to get vaccinated is needed to reach low-vaccine coverage communities.

Recommendation #3: Continue to provide area-specific information to elected officials within hot-spot communities

Monitor and provide specific analyses for low-vaccine coverage areas to reduce the risk of COVID transmission.

Recommendation #4: Work directly with schools and districts to prepare for the new school year

Continue to encourage parents with children under 12 years of age to get vaccinated.
