

Salt Lake Salt Lake County Council Update on Afghan Arrivals to Utah

October 5, 2021

What We Know

- As of September 24, 55,000 Afghans have been evacuated to U.S. military bases. These are people who worked closely with the U.S. military, NGOs and media, as well as their close family members.
 - An additional 15,000 evacuees are currently at U.S. military bases overseas en route to the U.S.
- Utah expects to resettle 765 Afghans, the majority of whom are humanitarian parolees.
 These are people who do not have a Special Immigrant Visa, but were granted humanitarian parole into the U.S. due to their vulnerabilities. They will be eligible to work and to apply for asylum (currently a two-year process), but will not be fast tracked for Green Cards.
 - These Afghan arrivals are in addition to the 1,200 refugees that will be coming to Utah from around the world during the coming year.

What Happens Next

- By October 1, 10,000 evacuees will have completed all medical requirements for their humanitarian parole status at the military bases, including a measles vaccine, and will be eligible for connection to resettlement.
- By October 15, everybody on bases will be medically cleared and will be eligible for resettlement; this is when we can be expected to see arrivals.
- A continuing resolution was passed by Congress and signed by the President on October 1, including funding to grant humanitarian parolees refugee benefits. They will be eligible for refugee benefits to cover basic needs, medical, food and housing for several months.
