




## CLERK CORE MISSION

We serve the public with integrity, respect, and an unwavering commitment to providing exceptional customer service. We treat each marriage and passport applicant with respect and professionalism.


### **Council Clerk Division:**

# MARRIAGE & PASSPORT 2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Initiated a successful new appointment scheduling system:
  - Currently, customers may schedule an appointment within 24 hours.
  - Scheduling software confirms appointment and provides reminder of documentation needed, eliminating duplicate trips and customer confusion.
- US Dept of State has been catching up on backlogged applications. Currently, routine passport applications are processed in 14 weeks, expedited passport applications are processed in 10 weeks.
  - Passport applicants continue to arrive from out of state.




# COUNCIL CLERK 2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS




# ELECTION CLERK 2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Contracted with 18 cities, three metro townships, and six special service districts to conduct their elections (reimbursed by each entity).
- Municipal Primary Election was held on August 10, 2021
   Election was certified by respective Boards of Canvassers for all five participating cities on August 24, 2021 (Herriman, Murray, Taylorsville, West Jordan, West Valley)
- General Election on November 2, 2021
- Dramatic increase in requests for records & participation in election activities

Recent national allegations of election fraud have had a large impact on our office. GRAMA requests have increased nearly 800% from 2020. These requests have included appeals to make public ballot drop box pick-up routes, copy all 498,471 signed envelope affidavits from by-mail ballots in the 2020 General Election, and release every email sent or received by Clerk Sherrie Swensen that included the terms "mail-in ballot," "absentee," or "dropbox."

## REDESTRICTING


- Provide administrative support to Redistricting Commission
- Census data not released until September 16<sup>th</sup>
- 2020 Census data shows 1,185, 238 residents, a growth of 15.1% over 2010 Census
- County Clerk & Surveyor staff created various map examples based on council and local school board redistricting criteria
- Deadline for finalization of precincts is December 31, 2021 to accommodate candidate filing beginning January 1, 2022 (those opting to gather signatures for ballot access)

#### RANKED CHOICE VOTING INSTRUCTIONS:

- To rank your candidates, fill in the oval next to their name:
- In the 1st column for your 1st choice candidate
- . In the 2nd column for your 2nd choice candidate, and so on

Do not fill in more than one oval:

- In a column
- · For a candidate



You may rank as many or as few candidates as you like, and you are not required to rank all candidates. If you skip a ranking, subsequent choice(s) in that contest will not be counted. If you make a mistake, mark the ballot so your intent is clear. Do not initial or sign the correction.

#### STANDARD VOTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Use only a black or blue pen. To vote your choice, fill in the oval to the right of your selection. If you make a mistake, mark the ballot so that your intent is clear. DO NOT initial or sign a correction. (For additional directions, refer to the instructions included in your ballot packet.) If you choose not to vote in every contest, it will not invalidate your ballot.

WRITE-IN: A write-in line is only available where a candidate has filed a Declaration of Write-in Candidacy. To vote for a write-in candidate, fill in the oval to the right of the write-in line and print the name of the candidate you want to vote for. We will consider voter intent if the complete name of the candidate is not entered.





- Capital Requests \$14,280
  Office copy machine & high-speed scanner
- Restoration of COVID Cut for Voting Machines \$1M
   300 voting machines & peripherals
- UPD Deputy Ballot Drop-box Pickup \$55,935
