**Mr. Brian Tucker**, Planning Manager, Municipal Services District (MSD), stated there was already a version of this flood prevention ordinance in Chapter 19.74 of the Salt Lake County Code. This ordinance would adopt Chapter 19.73 of the Code, which is an updated version of the flood

prevention ordinance. It would apply to all parts of the County except for those that are within migratory bird production areas, in accordance with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) regulations.

**Council Member Bradley** asked if the rider on migratory bird production areas put the MSD at a disadvantage.

Mr. Tucker stated he felt it did not.

**Mr. Zach Shaw**, Deputy District Attorney, stated the District Attorney's office has worked closely with FEMA on this ordinance, including the migratory bird component. FEMA is satisfied the existing ordinance is adequate for its purposes.
