Ms. Karen Crompton, Director, Human Services Division, stated the County has been efficient in using Medicaid funding this year and some one-time funding will be available to other projects. An opportunity has come up to support Volunteers of America in a new project they are working on called the Denver Street Housing Project. This Medicaid funding cannot be used for further treatment because it is one-time money.

Mr. Tim Whalen, Director, Behavioral Health Services, stated this project will house seriously mentally ill Medicaid consumers. It is a 22-unit rehab facility being done with a city tax credit. Volunteers of America (VOA) would be the property manager. This would be serving individuals coming out of the state hospital who are seriously mentally ill. Initially, it was thought that all costs were covered, however there is a \$400,000 shortfall.

Ms. Kathy Bray, President & Chief Executive Officer, Volunteers of America, Utah, stated the \$400,000 gap came about primarily because of increased construction costs.
