A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF SALT LAKE COUNTY APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING **EXECUTION** OF ANINTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT **BETWEEN SALT** LAKE COUNTY AND MILLCREEK COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AGENCY FOR A CONTRIBUTION OF TAX INCREMENT WITH RESPECT TO THE MILLCREEK CENTER COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT PROJECT AREA

RECITALS

- A. The Agency and the County are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code Ann. §§11-13-101 et seq. (the "Interlocal Act"), and, as such, are authorized by the Interlocal Act to enter into this Agreement to act jointly and cooperatively in a manner that will enable them to make the most efficient use of their resources and powers. Additionally, Section 11-13-215 of the Interlocal Act also authorizes a taxing entity to share its tax and other revenues with other public agencies.
- B. The governing body of the Agency adopted a resolution on May 14, 2018, authorizing the Agency to commence the process under the Act to create the Millcreek Center Community Reinvestment Project Area (the "Project Area"). The Agency and the Millcreek Council have prepared a proposed community reinvestment project area plan for the Project Area, pursuant to which the Agency plans to encourage and promote economic development in the Project area and in the surrounding community.
- C. The Act authorizes funding of community reinvestment project areas and plans such as the Project Area and the Project Area Plan with property tax increment pursuant to interlocal cooperation agreements with various taxing entities that levy property taxes in a project area. Specifically, Section 17C-5-202 of the Act provides that "an agency shall negotiate and enter into an interlocal agreement with a taxing entity in accordance with Section 17C-5-204 to receive all or a portion of the taxing entity's tax increment. . . in accordance with the interlocal agreement." Section 17C-5-204 of the Act provides that an agency may use the taxing entity's tax increment. [f]or the purpose of implementing a community reinvestment project area plan."
- D. The County, as a taxing entity, now desires to consent to the Agency receiving certain tax increment attributable to the County's Tax Levies (defined below) in accordance with the terms of this Agreement in order to provide funds to the Agency to carry out the Project Area Plan.
- E. Salt Lake County ("County"), as a taxing entity, now desires to consent to the Agency receiving certain tax increment attributable to the County's tax levies in accordance with the terms and

subject to the conditions of the interlocal cooperation agreement attached hereto as ATTACHMENT A (the "Interlocal Agreement") for the purpose of providing funds to the Agency to carry out the Project Area Plan for the Project Area.

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County (the "County") and Bluffdale City (the "City") are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code Ann. §§11-13-101 *et seq.* (the "Cooperation Act"), and, as such, are authorized by the Cooperation Act to enter into an interlocal cooperation agreement to act jointly and cooperatively on the basis of mutual advantage;

WHEREAS, during the 2015 General Session, the State Legislative amended Section 72-2-117.5 of the Utah Transportation Code (Utah Code Ann. §§ 72-1-101 et seq.) to provide corridor preservation funds to local counties for disbursement to various cities and governmental entities, as recommended and endorsed by a council of governments (hereinafter "Corridor Preservation Funds"); and
