#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, South Jordan City (the "City") has constructed and operates the South Jordan Fitness & Aquatic Center located at approximately 10866 South Redwood Road, South Jordan Utah 84095 (the "Rec Center") on a portion of the City Property identified as Parcel No. 27-15-376-016 (the "Rec Center Property").

WHEREAS, Salt Lake County (the "County") owns and operates the Salt Lake County Marv Jenson Recreation Center ("Marv Jenson") also located in South Jordan.

WHEREAS, the County is acquiring the Rec Center from the City and as part of the acquisition the County will assume operations and maintenance of the Rec Center pursuant to the terms of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of South Jordan and Salt Lake County [Operating Agreement for the South Jordan Fitness & Aquatic Center] (the "Operating Agreement ") until the Rec Center and the associated real and personal property is conveyed to the County under the Conveyance Agreement.

WHEREAS, the City will convey the Rec Center Property to the County on or promptly after January 1, 2022 by quit claim deed, pursuant to the terms of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between the City of South Jordan and Salt Lake County (the "Transfer Agreement").

WHEREAS, Marv Jenson no longer serves the County's recreational needs. Operating the Rec Center rather than constructing a new facility benefits the citizens of both the City and the County.

WHEREAS, as public agencies, the parties are authorized under the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code § 11-13-101, et seq. (the "Interlocal Act""), to make the most efficient use of their powers by acting cooperatively to provide needed services and facilities so that the parties benefit from economy of scale and shared resources.

#### RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "<u>County</u>") and University of Utah (the "<u>University</u>") are "public agencies" as defined by the Utah Interlocal Cooperation Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 11-13-101 et seq. (the "<u>Cooperation Act</u>"), and, as such, are authorized by the Cooperation Act to enter into this Agreement to act jointly and cooperatively on the basis of mutual advantage in order to provide facilities in a manner that will accord best with geographic, economic, population and other factors influencing the needs

and development of local communities.

B. The County receives funds ("<u>TRCC Funds</u>") pursuant to the Tourism, Recreation, Cultural, Convention, and Airport Facilities Tax Act, Utah Code Ann. §§ 59-12-601 et seq. (the "<u>TRCC Act</u>"). The TRCC Act provides that TRCC Funds may be used, among other things, for the development, operation, and maintenance of publicly owned or operated recreation, cultural, or convention facilities.

C. In 2016, the University requested TRCC Funds from the County-through the County's Cultural Facilities Support Program-to help it fund two capital projects at the Natural History Museum of Utah. The County Council appropriated TRCC Funds for this purpose in the 2017 Salt Lake County Budget.

D. The University and the County now desire to amend the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement as attached hereto ATTACHMENT A (the "<u>Interlocal Agreement</u>") to extend the University's deadline to expend the TRCC Funds provided to the University under the Agreement from September 30, 2019 to October 31, 2020 and to change the reporting deadline to December 31, 2020.

E. The County Council believes that its contribution and assistance under the Agreement will contribute to the prosperity, peace, and comfort of Salt Lake County residents.

#### WITNESSETH

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns fee title to several parcels of real property located at approximately 3383 South 300 East, South Salt Lake, Utah, identified as Parcel Nos. 16-30-381-003, 16-30-381-004, 16-30-381-005, 16-30-381-006, and 16-30-456-006 (the "County Property").

B. After marketing the County Property, Property Dynamics III, LLC, a Utah limited liability company ("Property Dynamics"), was selected by the County to purchase the County Property.

C. Property Dynamics has offered to purchase the property for \$1,824,000.00, which has been reviewed and approved by Salt Lake County Real Estate Division as a fair market value for the County Property.

D. The County and Property Dynamics have negotiated to convey the County Property pursuant to the terms and conditions of a Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement ("Purchase Agreement") attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

E. Having held public hearing after providing notice, the County declared the County Property surplus by Resolution No. 5469 on January 8, 2019.

F. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by conveying the County Property to Property Dynamics as proposed in the attached Purchase Agreement. The conveyance of the County Property will comply with all applicable state statues and County ordinances.
