RECITALS

1. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns a parcel of real property, Parcel No. 15- 12-179-006, located at approximately 418 West Montague Ave. (940 South), Salt Lake City, Utah (the "Property"), which was struck off to the County after the tax sale in 1912.

- 2. SLC Innovation District II, LLC ("SLC Innovation"), has offered in writing to purchase the Property from the County for \$4,800.00, which amount has been approved by the Salt Lake County Real Estate Section as fair market value. This offer is in the form of a Tax Sale Property Purchase Agreement (the "Agreement") attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 3. The County has determined that the Property is not in public use. Proceeds from the sale of the Property will be distributed in accordance with Section 59-2-1351.5 of the Utah Code.
- 4. It has been determined that the best interest of the County and the general public will be served by the sale and conveyance of the Property to SLC Innovation. The sale and conveyance will be in compliance with all applicable state statutes and county ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the Property, described in Exhibit 1 of the Agreement is hereby declared surplus property.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the sale and conveyance of the Property by quit-claim deed to SLC Innovation as provided in the Agreement for the agreed appraised value of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars and Zero Cents (\$4,800.00) is hereby approved; and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Agreement and the Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the Quit-Claim Deed, attached to the Agreement as Exhibit 2, and to deliver the fully executed documents to the County Real Estate Section for delivery to SLC Innovation upon payment of the agreed upon purchase amount.
