2. CITIZEN PUBLIC INPUT

Ms. Amy McKasson stated she participated in a group with people who had different viewpoints on a school curriculum and had two takeaways: participants were there because they cared about what was being taught; and problems can be solved if people are willing to understand other's intentions, collaborate together, and compromise.

WHEREAS, a tornado warning was issued for Paris, Kentucky the day of the meet and the Draper Racecats ran through 40 mile per hour winds, hail, and rain; and

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF SALT LAKE AUTHORIZING COUNTY, (THE "COUNTY"), AND UTAH PURCHASE APPROVING TWO SEPARATE FORWARD BOND AGREEMENTS AND TWO SEPARATE CONTINUING **COVENANT** AGREEMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE COUNTY'S SALES TAX REVENUE REFUNDING BONDS. SERIES 2024A AND GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2025A; AND RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the County Council of the County (the "Council") has previously authorized the issuance of its (i) Sales Tax Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 2024A (the "STRR Bonds") and (ii) General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2025A (the "GO Bonds" and collectively with the STRR Bonds, the "Bonds") (each to be issued in one or more series and with such other series or title designation(s) as may be determined) pursuant to resolutions adopted by the Council on January 4, 2022 (collectively the "Bond Resolutions") to refinance certain outstanding sales tax revenue and general obligations bonds (respectively) of the County; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, the Council desires to approve the forms of (i) a Forward Bond Purchase Agreement relating to the STRR Bonds in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u> (the "STRR FBPA") between the County and DNT Asset Trust ("DNT"), (ii) a Continuing Covenant Agreement relating to the STRR Bonds in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C</u> (the "STRR CCA") between the County and DNT, (iii) a Forward Bond Purchase Agreement

relating to the GO Bonds in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit</u> <u>D</u> (the "GO FBPA" and together with the STRR FBPA, the "FBPAs") between the County and DNT, and (iv) a Continuning Covenant Agreement relating to the GO Bonds in substantially the form attached hereto as <u>Exhibit</u> <u>E</u> (the "GO CCA" and together with the STRR CCA, the "CCAs") between the County and DNT; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to delegate to any one of the Mayor or her designee (collectively, the "Mayor"), the Chief Financial Officer or the Treasurer of the County (each a "Designated Officer"), the ability to finalize and make any alterations, changes or additions to the documents in the preceding preamble so long as the Bonds and terms do not exceed the financial parameters of the Bond Resolutions;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Salt Lake County, Utah, as follows:

Section 1. The FBPAs and CCAs in substantially the forms attached hereto as Exhibits B, C, D and E are hereby approved and such other documents required to be delivered in connection with the FBPAs and the CCAs (the "Related Documents"), and the Council hereby authorizes the execution and delivery of the FBPAs, the CCAs and the Related Documents by the Designated Officers and any other appropriate officials of the County, or their designees, for and on behalf of the County, with such changes as may be recommended by legal counsel to the County or made pursuant to Section 2 herein.

<u>Section 2.</u> Any one of the Designated Officers or other appropriate officials of the County are hereby authorized to make any alterations, changes or additions to the FBPAs, the CCAs and the Related Documents within the financial parameters of the Bond Resolutions, or which may be necessary to conform the same to the final terms of the Bonds, to correct errors or omissions therein, to complete the same, to remove ambiguities therefrom, or to conform the same to the provisions of said instruments, the Bond Resolutions and this Resolution or any resolution adopted by the Council or the provisions of the laws of the State of Utah or the United States.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Designated Officers and other appropriate officials of the County, and each of them, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and

deliver for and on behalf of the County any or all additional certificates, documents and other papers and to perform all other acts they may deem necessary or appropriate in order to implement and carry out the matters authorized in this Resolution and the documents authorized and approved herein.

<u>Section 4.</u> All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed and this resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its approval and adoption.

<u>Section 5.</u> This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its approval and adoption.

Α RESOLUTION OF THE SALT LAKE COUNTY **COUNCIL** AUTHORIZING APPROVING A AND THE MAYOR TO **EXECUTE** THREE PERPETUAL EASEMENT ACCESS AGREEMENTS FOR DIMPLE DELL PARK

RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") maintains a parking lot and equestrian trail facilities (the "Trail Facilities") on a parcel of land that is a portion of Dimple Dell Park, which is located at approximately 1531 East 10600 South, in Sandy, Utah, identified as Tax ID No. 28-16-176-004 (the "County Property").

B. Alta View Shopping Center, LLC ("Shopping Center"), owns a parcel of land located at 10365 South 1300 East in Sandy City, Utah, identified as Tax ID No. 28-16-101-027 ("Shopping Center Property").

C. Alta View Associates, LLC ("Alta View Associates") owns a parcel of land located at 10315 South 1300 East in Sandy City, Utah, identified as Tax ID No. 28-16-101-029 ("Alta View Associate Property").

D. White Investment Company Inc. ("White Investment"), owns a parcel of land located at 10365 South 1300 East in Sandy City, Utah, identified as Tax ID No. 28-16-101-030 ("White Investment Property").

E. The Shopping Center Property, Alta View Associate Property and White Investment Property are all adjacent to or in close proximity to the County Property and are collectively referred to as the "Commercial Property."

F. The County has used an existing drive aisle or roadway on the Commercial Property to access the Trail Facilities for decades.

G. The County, the Shopping Center, Alta View Associates, and White Investment desire to document and memorialize a perpetual easement on, over and across the Commercial Property to allow the County and its employees, agents, contractors and invitees, including members of the public to access the Trail Facilities.

H. The County has prepared Perpetual Access Easement Agreements with each of the Shopping Center, Alta View Associates, and White Investment, the forms of which are attached hereto Exhibits A, B, and C (collectively, the "Easement Agreements") wherein each entity grants a perpetual easement to the County over its respective parcel in the Commercial Property. I. Since these easements reflect the long-standing, existing use of the Commercial Property, the easements are granted for no fee.

J. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by executing the Easement Agreements. The terms and conditions of the Easement Agreements are in compliance with all applicable state statutes and county ordinances.
