A RESOLUTION OF THE SALT LAKE COUNTY COUNCIL APPROVING THE LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN SALT LAKE COUNTY AND FRIENDS OF SWITCHPOINT, INC.

RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns certain improved real property in Millcreek, Utah formerly known as the Calvin Smith Library located at 810 East 3300 South, Millcreek, Utah, Parcel No. 16-20-355-012 (the "Facility"). The Facility is currently closed and no longer used as a library.

B. Friends of Switchpoint, Inc. ("Switchpoint"), a Utah non-profit corporation, is working with the County to provide temporary housing solutions to those experiencing homelessness.

C. Switchpoint would like to lease the Facility as a temporary overflow shelter for the winter. Millcreek has authorized this temporary use of the Facility under certain conditions, and Switchpoint has agreed to abide by those conditions, which have been integrated, along with other terms and conditions, into a Lease Agreement (the "Lease") between the County and Switchpoint. A copy of the Lease is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

D. Pursuant to Section 17-50-303(3)(a) of the Utah Code, it has been determined that leasing the Facility to Switchpoint contributes to the safety, health, prosperity, moral well-being, peace, order, comfort, or convenience of county residents, and may be done on this temporary basis for no fee.

E. It has been determined that the best interests of Salt Lake County will be served by leasing the Facility to Switchpoint as provided in the Lease.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Salt Lake County Council for the reasons stated in the Recitals that the Lease between the County and Switchpoint is hereby approved, and the Mayor is authorized to sign the Lease on behalf of the County.

RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") through its Parks and Recreation Division owns and manages the Wheeler Historic Farm, located at 6351 South 900 East, Salt Lake City, Utah, 84121, which consists of 75 acres and represents a restoration of the turn-of-the-century dairy farm of Henry J. Wheeler (the "Property" and/or "Wheeler Farm").

B. Granite School District's ("GSD") Granite Technical Institute ("GTI"), operates an Agriculture and Natural Resource Science Program ("Program") through which GSD's students get hands on instructions and experience with farm animals and its natural resources.

C. GSD desires access to County's Property for purposes of applying principles learned in the classroom to real-world agriculture and the environment.

D. County desires GSD's Program to provide support services for the animals and grounds at Wheeler Farm, and would like to accommodate GSD's Program at Wheeler Farm.

E. The County will not charge GSD any consideration for the use of Wheeler Farm to conduct its GTI Program.

F. The County and GSD have prepared an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement"), attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

G. Pursuant to Section 17-50-303(3)(a) of the Utah Code, it has been determined that the County entering into the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with GSD contributes to the safety, health, prosperity, moral well-being, peace, order, comfort, or convenience of county residents, and may be done for no consideration.

H. It has also been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by County entering into the Agreement with GSD, as provided in the agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and by this reference made a part of this Resolution, is hereby approved; and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute said Agreement.

RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns and manages the Copperview Recreation Center, located at 8446 Harrison Street, Midvale, Utah 84047 (the

"Property").

B. Founded in 1965, Salt Lake Community Action Program dba Utah Community Action (hereinafter "Utah Community Action"), is one of the largest nonprofit agencies dedicated to fighting poverty and its root causes in Today, Utah Community Action serves over 60,000 people annually Utah. through six core programs - Adult Education, Case Management & Housing, Preschool. HEAT Head Start Utility Assistance. Nutrition. and Weatherization for Homes.

C. Utah Community Action desires to lease from County a room ("Room A") at the Property, which consists of approximately 836 square feet, to be used by Utah Community Action to administer its utility assistance and housing rental assistance programs.

D. As consideration for the lease of Room A, Utah Community Action will pay to County the sum of five thousand eight hundred fifty two dollars (\$5,852.00) per annum, and a prorated share of the utilities.

E. The County and Utah Community Action have prepared a Lease Agreement ("Lease Agreement"), attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

F. Pursuant to Section 17-50-303(3)(a) of the Utah Code, it has been determined that leasing the Property to Utah Community Action contributes to the safety, health, prosperity, moral well-being, peace, order, comfort, or convenience of county residents, and may be done at this reduced rate.

F. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by County entering into the Lease Agreement with Utah Community Action, as provided in the Lease Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the Lease Agreement, attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and by this reference made a part of this Resolution, is hereby approved; and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute said Lease Agreement.

RECITALS

A. Salt Lake County (the "County") owns and manages the Copperview Recreation Center, located at 8446 Harrison Street, Midvale, Utah 84047, and the Redwood Recreation Center, located at 3060 South Lester Street, West Valley City, Utah 84119.

B. The County leases property from the Granite School District commonly known as the Hillview Elementary School, located at 4405 South 1025 East, Salt Lake City, Utah 84124, and operates the Millcreek Activity Center from that location.

C. Founded in 1965, Salt Lake Community Action Program (hereinafter "SLCAP"), is one of the largest nonprofit agencies dedicated to fighting poverty and its root causes in Utah. Today, SLCAP serves over 60,000 people annually through six core programs - Adult Education, Case Management & Housing, Head Start Preschool, HEAT Utility Assistance, Nutrition, and Weatherization for Homes.

D. SLCAP desires to lease from County space at the Copperview Recreation Center, the Redwood Recreation Center, and sub-lease space at the Millcreek Activity Center (hereinafter referred to as the "Properties"), to run and operate its Head Start Preschool program, on the following terms and conditions: 1. Copperview Recreation Center: SLCAP to lease approximately four thousand three hundred fifty four (4,354) square feet of classroom space at a rate of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) per year, on the terms and conditions set forth in the Lease Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and incorporated herein by this reference.

2. Redwood Recreation Center: SLCAP to lease approximately two thousand one hundred (2,100) square feet of space at a rate of two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200.00) per year, on the terms and conditions set forth in the Lease Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit 2, and incorporated herein by this reference.

3. Millcreek Activity Center: SLCAP to sub-lease approximately eight hundred forty six (846) square feet of classroom space at a rate of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) per year, on the terms and conditions set forth in the Sub-Lease Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit 3, and incorporated herein by this reference.

E. Pursuant to Section 17-50-303(3)(a) of the Utah Code, it has been determined that sub-leasing and leasing the Properties to SLCAP contributes to the safety, health, prosperity, moral well-being, peace, order, comfort, or convenience of County residents, and may be done at these reduced rates.

F. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by County entering into the Sub-Lease and Lease Agreements with SLCAP, on the terms and conditions provided in the Sub-Lease and Lease Agreements.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Salt Lake County Council that the Sub-Lease and Lease Agreements, attached hereto as Exhibits 1, 2, and 3, and by this reference made a part of this Resolution, are hereby approved; and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute said Sub-Lease and Lease Agreements.
